HOW YOU CAN BE INVOLVED:

- **Classroom Presentation:** present to students who you are, what you do, your career path, and about your organization and career opportunities
- **Classroom Project:** introduce students to a real-life project or problem to solve
- **Career Events:** represent your organization at local career fairs, career panels, or career days
- **Facility Tour/Site Visit:** host a group of students to tour your facility and learn about careers and your organization
- **Informational Interview:** you or a member of your team is willing to meet with a student to answer questions about your organization, your work, and your career path
- **Job Shadow:** have a student or students job shadow for a half day, a full day, a week, or as a part of a rotation with other employers
- **Internship:** internships involve students learning about the organization and career field while gaining career-related work experience
- **Learning Donation:** donate materials or items to enhance student learning in classrooms
- **Summer Rotational Shadow:** students shadow in numerous departments or with multiple employers to explore different occupations within an industry
- **Youth Apprenticeship:** youth apprenticeship programs are paid experiences developed with a licensed work-based learning coordinator that includes a written agreement and training plan required by the school, employer, student, and parent/guardian
